





Youngsters Try their Hand at Brick Laying

Youngsters from a Sandwell school swapped building blocks for bricks when they were visited by a builder.

The four and five-year-olds from Shireland Hall Primary School were visited by builder Chris Packington, a Construction Lecturer at City of Wolverhampton College.



Chris introduced children to the equipment used as a builder and told them about the importance of safety, before demonstrating how to build a wall. The children were then given their own mini-brick and trowel and were given the chance to test their brick laying skills.
